Innovations



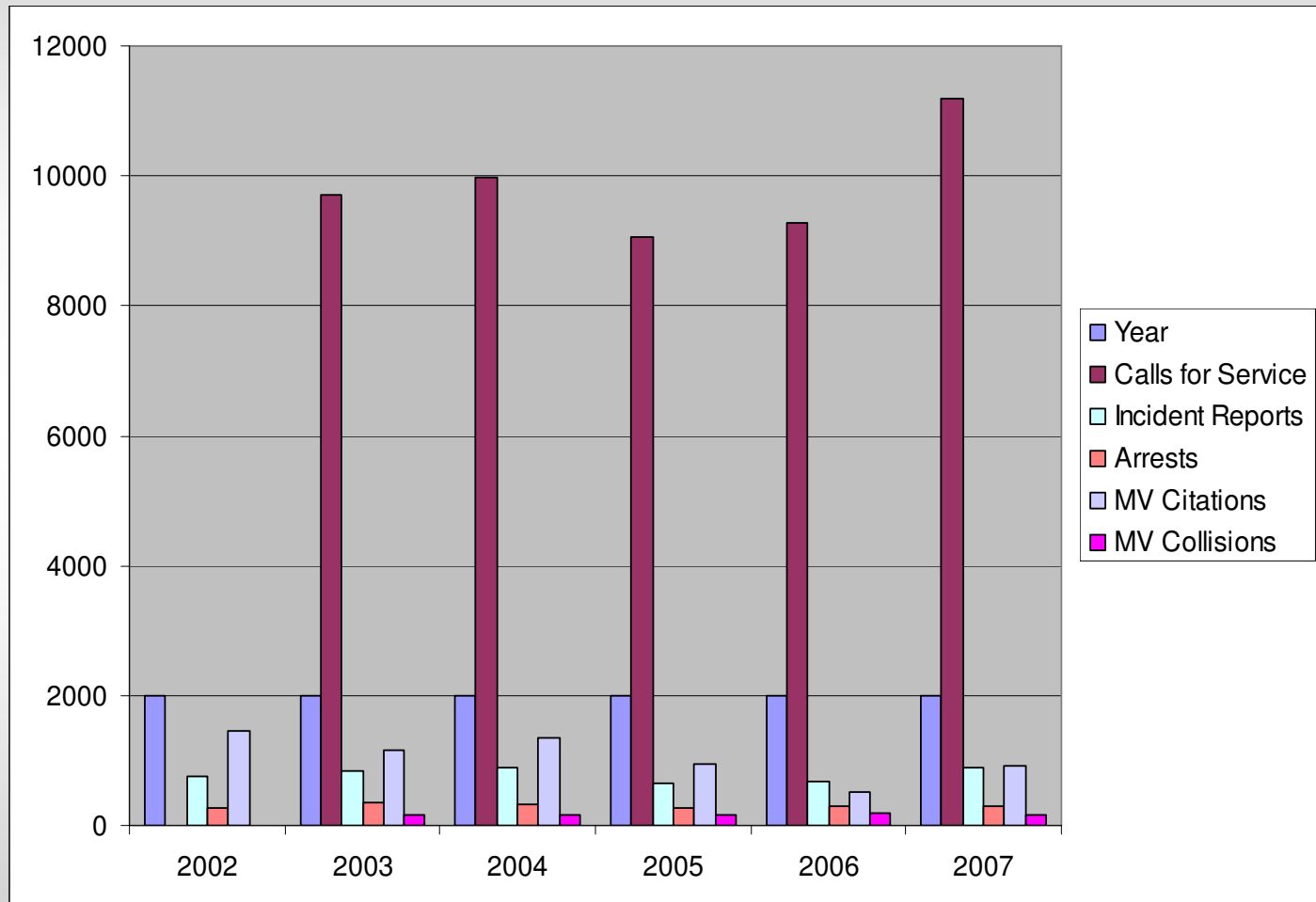
- Augment supervisory accountability

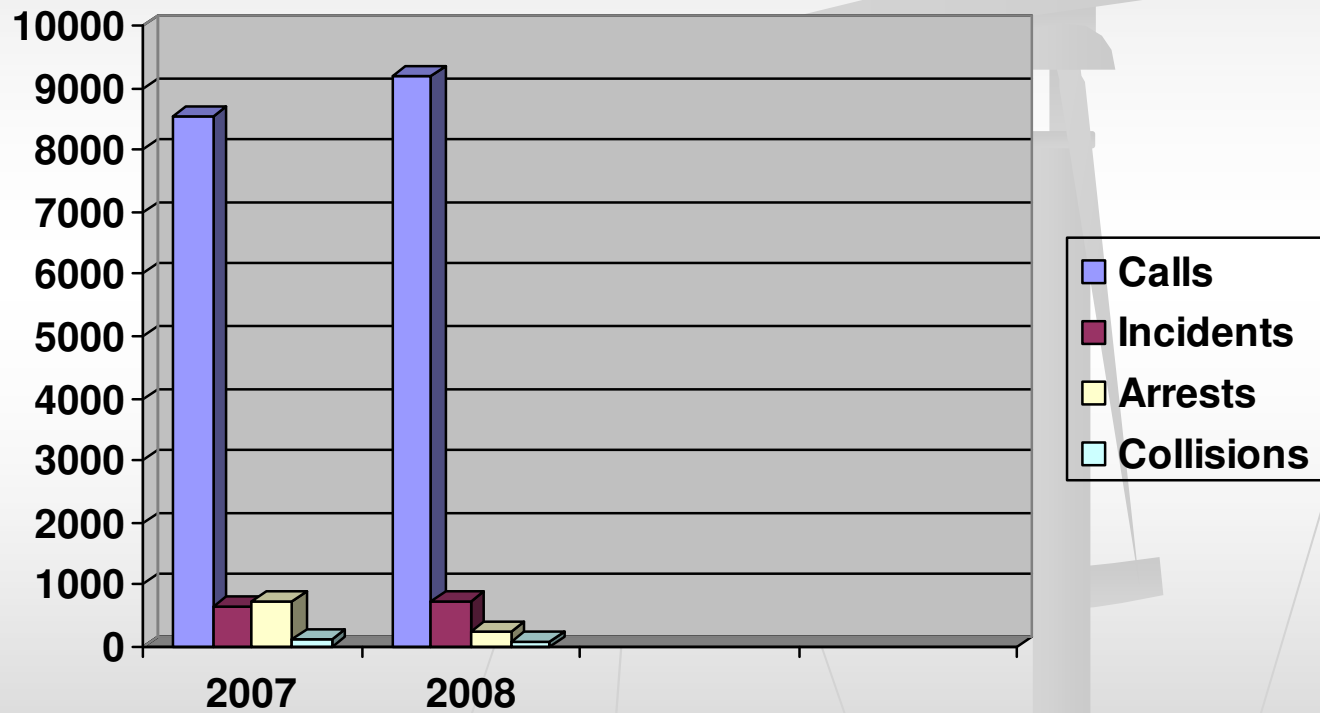
- Established a functional case management system



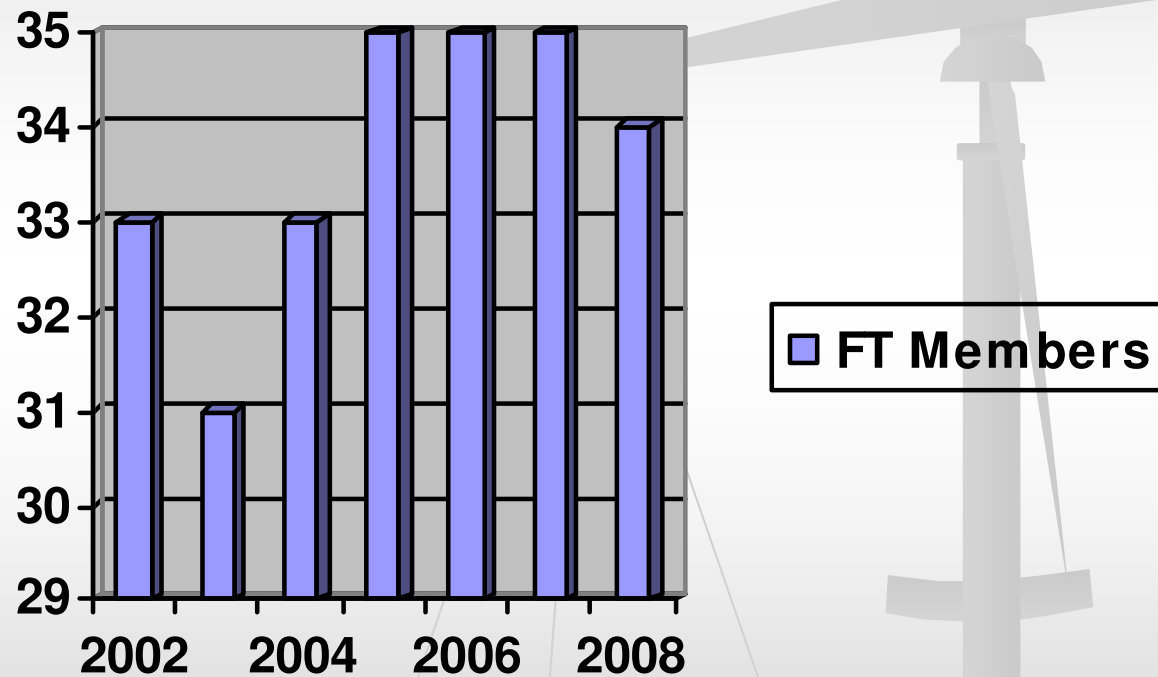
