Meeting Minutes TSAC November 2017

DATE: December 26, 2017
SUBJECT: **TSAC Minutes from November 15, 2017**

Meeting called to order by Michael Diluiso at 8:07 am.

Members Present:

Mike Diluiso stated he spoke with DPW Director Calla who was unable to attend the meeting today and has not finalized a recommendation with regard to the layout of the area.

Deputy Chief Goodwin stated that there has been some informal conversation regarding the issue.

Proponents of the issue Mary Lou Osborn and Roger Plant, area residents, provided a photoshopped picture of what the area may look like if bollards were placed in the area.

John Eade wished to bring up an item for discussion under old business.

Mr. Eade wished to note conditions at the Bowdoin St/River Rd/Wadsworth Ave intersection. Due to the absence of a stop sign on part of the intersection, he may wish to place this on a future TSAC agenda.

Mike Diluiso recommended checking the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices prior to placing this item on a future agenda to ensure that any additional stop sign would not be non-conforming.

A brief discussion continued regarding the current signage and regulations at that intersection and some concerns of some area residents regarding the conditions.

Deputy Chief Goodwin wished to discuss a previous issue on Bowdoin Street regarding parking regulations and a resident's ability to pull in to and out of their driveway. Mike Diluiso summarized the previous findings of TSAC regarding the issue and what would need to be done in order to have the sign and restriction reposted. John Eade also added a reminder that this is a common issue in many areas of the town.
